INFORMATION FOR ALL CRIME VICTIMS

If you would like to be notified of an arrest in your case or the release of the person arrested, or both, you should call the police department listed on this form and let them know.

If you are not notified of an arrest in your case, you may call this law enforcement agency at the phone number listed for the status of the case.

You may obtain a copy of the police incident report for your case by calling the phone number listed.

If the suspect has been arrested, a bond may be set and the suspect may be released. You may call the police department listed on this form or the Macomb County Sheriff's Department at 586-469-5151 to find out if the suspect is still in custody.

CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION

If you are injured as a direct result of a crime, you may be eligible for crime victim's compensation benefits. You may submit an application for reimbursement to:

MI-VINE

1-800-770-7657

Is a free, confidential, computer-based service that provides two important services to victims of crime – information and notification regarding crimes committed in Michigan.

INFORMATION

For defendant or inmate custody status and court information, call 1-800-770-7657 and follow the automated prompts. You may also press "0" at any time during the call to speak to a representative. The MI-VINE is available in English and Spanish.

NOTIFICATION

In addition, crime victims may choose to register for automated telephone notifications when an offender has a change in custody status throughout the criminal justice process. Registration is confidential. Anyone may register to receive network notification of change in custody status for offenders housed in county jails by calling 1-800-770-7657. The only information required from you is a telephone number which is kept secure and confidential. If you choose to register for notification, you will receive a PIN (Personal Identification Number). The PIN is a four digit number that you choose which will be kept secure and confidential. Select a number that is easy for you to remember and write it down. After you get a notification call from the network, enter your PIN using the touch tone numbers on your telephone. That will let the network system know that you have received the message. If there is no answer or the line is busy, call will continue for a minimum of 24 hours. The network will leave a message on an answering machine, but will continue to call for 24 hours or until a PIN is entered.

PERSONAL PROTECTION ORDERS

Your legal rights include the right to go to court and file a petition requesting a Personal Protection Order to protect you and the other members of your household from domestic abuse. The Order would restrain or enjoin an individual from one or more of the following:

- Entering onto the premises
- Assaulting, attacking, beating, molesting, or wounding you
- Threatening to kill or physically injury you
- Removing minor children from you, except as otherwise authorized by a custody or visitation order issued by a court of competent jurisdiction
- Purchasing or possessing a firearm
- Interfering with your efforts to remove your children or personal property from premises that are solely owned or leased by the individual to be restrained
- Interfering with you at your place of employment or engaging in conduct that impairs your employment relationship or environment
- Engaging in any other specific act or conduct that imposes upon or interferes with you personal liberty or that causes a reasonable apprehension of violence.

You do not need an attorney to obtain a Personal Protection Offer. Forms are available at the Macomb County Clerk's Office. If you would like assistance, you may contact:

INFORMATION FOR VICTIMS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT

- 1. You can have a sexual assault medical forensic examination and have evidence collected using a sexual assault evidence kit even if you do not want to participate in the criminal justice system or cooperate with law enforcement.
- 2. You cannot be billed for the cost of administrating the sexual assault evidence kit. If you receive a bill for these services, contact the Michigan Crime Victim Services Commission at 517-373-7373.
- 3. You have the right to ask the investigating law enforcement agency for the contact information for the detective or investigating officer assigned to the case, the current status of the case, whether the case has been submitted to the prosecuting attorney for review, and whether the case has been closed and the documented reason for closure.
- 4. If you had a sexual assault evidence kit collected and released to law enforcement, you have a right to ask the investigating law enforcement agency for the following information: when the sexual assault evidence kit was sent to a forensic laboratory for testing; whether a DNA profile was obtained from the sexual assault evidence kit; whether a DNA profile was entered into CODIS; and whether a DNA profile resulted in a CODIS hit.
- 5. Your legal rights include the right to go to court and file a petition requesting a personal protection order (PPO)/Restraining Order to protect you from the perpetrator. The PPO could order the perpetrator not to have contact with you and include other specific conditions.
